CHAIRMAN'S REPORT ON-LINE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 3rd DECEMBER 2020

Dear President, Vice President, Members and Fellow Committee Members,

Well, 2020 has been - and continues to be - dominated by the worldwide pandemic, and Rearsby Lodge Riding Club has inevitably been significantly impacted by that. I am immensely grateful to everyone for your quick responses to the ever-changing circumstances in which we have found ourselves. At times it has felt like being delicately perched on the top of a massive wave on a surfboard with absolutely no idea as to destination, temperature, speed, wind power - or precipitation!

In addition to that, 2020 will be memorable in the long-term history of the club, as it was the year in which Brooksby-Melton College terminated our agreement, which has effectively been in place since 1997. It will undoubtedly mean ongoing challenges in the future in terms of finding suitable venues, but I do hope that it will prove to also represent opportunities for the club to move forward, expand and remain successful. After looking at all indoor competition venues within our reach, your committee decided to try out Pickering Grange - while continuing to use a range of different venues for training clinics.

2020 was also the year that opened up time and head space for the committee to develop a brand new website. Kate Hill led all the work with tremendous technical and people skills, and it has already received a lot of positive comments. I hope that everyone associated with the club will feel a real sense of pride in it. If anyone wants to contribute to it - in words and/or pictures - we would be absolutely delighted to hear from you. We are grateful to Claire Atkins for having administered the previous one for a very long time - thank you so much, Claire.

At the beginning of 2020 the committee created a 'social task group' to explore non-mounted and mounted activities for our members in response to information from members at the last AGM in 2019. The group commenced that work, but was of course interrupted in March. It will be picked up once the Covid situation has settled.

One of this year's explicit goals for the committee was to increase the club's membership, which has run at around 100 for several years now. As you can all imagine, it remains at that level at the end of this year. We are setting ourselves that goal too for 2021, so it would be great if everyone could continue to promote club membership at every opportunity, particularly on social media.

Dressage Shows

If anyone can shed any light on the reasons for that, I would be very grateful. It must be acknowledged though that the income for the club from the arena eventing competitions was excellent.

Quadrille

Generali World Club Tournament in France

Yasmin Thorpe, Helen Garner and Beccy Binks in Team Beech were 4th and Team Oak comprising Celia Dyson, Jules Johnson, Alix Davis and Alice Smith had a good outing too. Alice Smith jumped a double clear in the 80cm to finish 9th. Hannah, Jules, Dawn, Becca, Yasmin, Beccy and Di achieved individual placings too.

The club is extremely proud of all riders and horses - and their results - and I would like to thank you and congratulate you all on being such fabulous competitors and on representing our club. Many thanks also to the Team Managers, Tracy Walker, Rachel Frew, Nicky Grayson, Claire Atkins and Becca Smith. We are looking for a junior team manager for 2021. In 2021 we will trial the role of Team Captain to support the teams and their managers, so we hope that will support the team managers and the teams as well as building capacity for team managers in the future.

We actively encourage all our members to compete in a team. Area Qualifiers are held throughout the year for all 440 affiliated riding clubs in the UK. It is great fun and will enable you to compete in many different venues, and if you qualify to compete at national championships. The support that is provided by the Team Managers is second to none, and you will be made very welcome. It really is for everyone!
